A NOTE FROM THE DIRECTOR

Cited "Best Performance In A Play 2017" by *The Wall Street Journal* for her portrayal of "Esther" in Lynn Nottage's *Intimate Apparel* at Shakespeare & Co., Nehassaiu is also recipient of the 2016 Berkshire Theatre Award for Outstanding Supporting Actress for her multiple-character work in Shakespeare & Co's production of Liz Duffy Adams' *Or,*. Off-Broadway, she originated "Angie" in Soho Rep's Obie Award winning production of Aleshea Harris' *Is God Is* and "Arkadina" in The Assembly's world premiere *SEAGULLMACHINE*. Nehassaiu has twice served as featured performer for The UN Trust Fund To End



Violence Against Women and toured nationally with choreographer Cynthia Oliver's interdisciplinary work on Caribbean diaspora, women and calypso, Rigidigidim De Bambe De. Her solo-show Door of No Return, originally produced by Rites and Reason Theatre at Brown University, has been presented at several theatres and colleges in NY and the Northeast. Her published works include The Frangipani Door, winner of Perishable Theatre's International Women Playwrights Award, two poetry chapbooks— *Undressing* The River, selected by Kimiko Hahn for the 2011 Center For Book Arts National Letterpress Prize, and Percussion, Salt & Honey, selected by Michael Harper for the Philbrick Poetry Prize. Her first book-length collection of poems. *Music For Exile* is due out from Tupelo Press in 2021. Nehassaiu holds an MFA from Brown University and trained at Trinity Rep Conservatory. Based in Brooklyn, she is a 52nd St Project Volunteer, a proud member of AEA, and is represented by The Talent House, New York & Toronto. Recipient of an Assembly Theater Deceleration Lab Grant, Nehassaiu is actively dreaming up ways to collaboratively devise while social distancing to create a work exploring Elizabeth Barrett Browning, race, taboo and literary inheritance. She plays "Krystal Rullan" in Taheim Bryan's timely indie feature, Equal Standard, co-produced by Ice-T; and will teach in Princeton University's Theater Program this fall.

Welker White (ACTOR) has worked as an actor and educator for over 30 years. Vanessa Walters (PERFORMER) is a Brooklyn-based choreographer, director, filmmaker, and performer. Her ongoing multimedia project Ripening has been featured at Lincoln Center, Tribeca Film Festival, Triskelion Arts, NADA Art Fair/Art Basel, Galapagos Art Space, FLICfest Dance Festival, and others. Through live performance, film, installation and virtual reality, Ripening explores human psychosocial relationships with time and the wonder and cruelty it wreaks. Prior to creating *Ripening* in 2012, Walters was lead choreographer/dancer for Fischerspooner



for 11 years, choreographing and performing for stage and video. The Fischerspooner production *Between Worlds* was created in collaboration with The Wooster Group and toured internationally. In 2016 and 2017, Walters toured extensively in performance collaboration with Gogol Bordello. Walters has choreographed and performed in several films and videos with artist / director Marcel Dzama, most notably "Une Danse des Bouffons" (Toronto Film Festival), NYCB video installation at Lincoln Center, and in live performance at PS1 MoMA. Walters is the show choreographer for TruTV's "At Home with Amy Sedaris," just having completed season 3 in February of 2020. Vanessa has also collaborated with Kate Mueth on several NPC productions, most notably "Eve" and "Hysteria". An inaugural 2018 Sokoloff Arts fellow, Walters is a returning 2020 resident at Town Stages, and also a 2020 Harkness Foundation for Dance Grantee for Ripening.

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PLAYWRIGHTS

Dipti Bramhandkar (PLAYWRIGHT) is a NYC based playwright. Her first play, *The Accident*, won Best Drama at the Frigid Festival, which inspired her to explore the interstices between prose and dramatic performance in her work. She was the playwright-inresidence at Guild Hall in 2019. Her autobiographical solo show, *American Rookie*, was performed at the Gotham Storytelling Festival, and received a full production at Luna Stage in January 2020; the run was sold out and extended. She presented her play *Islands of Contentment* at LAByrinth Theater's Barn Series in January 2020. Currently, she is developing a new play titled *Camping* with Narativ UK, and continuing to write episodes for *Quarantheater* a collection of stories inspired by the pandemic. The collection was featured on WNYC earlier this year. She is in post-production on her first short film, *The Choice*, starring Bobby Daniel Rodriguez and directed by Adam Valencia. In addition, she is

Joy Behar (PLAYWRIGHT) is an Emmy award winning co-host of The View. Acting TV credits include *Baby Boom* and Woody Allen's *Crisis in Six Scenes*. She has performed stand up comedy for over thirty years and appeared in several films, including Nora Ephron's *This is Your Life*, and Woody Allen's *Manhattan Murder Mystery*. In theatre, she starred in Nicky Silver's *The Food Chain* and *The Vagina Monologues*. She wrote and starred in her own one woman show, *Me, My Mouth, and I*, which ran at the Cherry Lane Theatre. Most recently, she wrote a book, The Great Gasbag: An A to Z Guide to Surviving Trump World.

POET

JUNE JORDAN (POET) was a poet, activist, journalist, essayist and teacher. Prolific and passionate, she was an influential voice who lived and wrote on the frontlines of American poetry, international political vision and human moral witness. The author of many award-winning books, she traveled widely to read her poems and to proclaim a vision of liberation for all people. Dynamic, rebellious, and courageous, June Jordan was, and still is, a lyrical catalyst for change. Born in Harlem in 1936, Jordan was the child of West Indian immigrant parents, who raised her in the Bedford-Stuyvesant section of Brooklyn, where she began writing poetry at the age of seven. In her teens, she attended the



Northfield School for Girls in Massachusetts, and in 1953 enrolled at Barnard College, where she would earn her B.A. She was married in 1955, and divorced after having one child. Jordan was active in the civil rights, feminist, antiwar and gay and lesbian rights movements, even as she became known as a writer. In 1967, after running poetry workshops for children in Harlem, Jordan began her teaching career at the City College of New York. She taught at Yale University and Sarah Lawrence College, and became a professor of English at the State University of New York at Stony Brook, where she directed The Poetry Center. In 1988, she was appointed professor of African-American Studies at the University of California, Berkeley, where she founded the influential poetry program Poetry For the People. June Jordan was the author of more than twenty-five major works of poetry, fiction and essays, as well as numerous children's books. Jordan wrote the librettos for the operas Bang Bang Uber Alles with music by Adrienne Torf, and I Was Looking at the Ceiling and Then I Saw the Sky, with music by John Adams; she wrote lyrics frequently for other musicians, as well as plays and musicals. Her journalism was published widely in magazines and newspapers around the world, and she was a regular columnist for The Progressive. An electrifying speaker, Jordan collected many of her most influential speeches and addresses in her books of essays. Jordan earned numerous honors and awards, including a 1969-1970 Rockefeller grant for creative writing, a Yaddo residency (1979), a National Endowment for the Arts fellowship (1982) and the Achievement Award for International Reporting from the National Association of Black Journalists (1984). Jordan also won the Lila Wallace Reader's Digest Writers Award (1995-1998), the Ground Breakers-Dream Makers Award from The Woman's Foundation (1994), the Chancellor's Distinguished Lectureship from the University of California at Berkeley, the PEN Center USA West Freedom to Write Award (1991) and a congressional citation for her outstanding contributions to literature, the progressive movement and the civil rights movement.

Lucy Boyle (PLAYWRIGHT) plays include *The Blue Deep* (Williamstown Theatre Festival with Blythe Danner, directed by Bob Balaban), *Girls' School Gothic* (Hangar Theatre), and *Mort* (*F*It Club*). She wrote for the ABC Family television series HUGE, created by Winnie Holzman. She was a member of Ensemble Studio Theatre's Youngblood Playwrights Collective, and the Dramatists' Guild Fellows. She received her BA from Brown University magna cum laude and her MFA in acting from Brown/Trinity Rep. She's thrilled to be a part of Andromeda's Sisters again this year.

Lynn Grossman is a playwright, screenwriter and political activist living in New York City. Her short stories have been published in "TriQuarterly," "Story Quarterly," "Equator Magazine "and "The Quarterly" and have been anthologized and translated into many languag

SARAH BIERSTOCK (PLAYWRIGHT) Actress Sarah Bierstock's first play, Honor Killing, received its first development through the John Drew Theater Lab at Guild Hall. It went on to a WORLD PREMIERE that ran for eight weeks-at Florida Studio Theatre (FST) to full capacity audiences. It received its second production at Athena Project in Denver, CO. Honor Killing was read at WAM Theater in West Stockbride, CT, as part of the Fresh Takes Series. In 2017, it was one of three plays featured in the New Works Reading Series at the Athena Theater, FST's Sarasota Festival of New Plays, and the PROJECT W Festival at the Cherry Lane Theatre in New York City (InProximity Theater). Sarah received an award for 2nd Runner up for The Woodward International Playwriting Prize at the University of New Hampshire earlier in 2017, where two readings of Honor Killing were conducted both at the University of New Hampshire and the 3S Artspace in Portsmouth, NH. Honor Killing

received Honorable Mention for the Bridge Initiative Playwriting Contest: Playwright of the Year Award, was a Finalist for the 2017 Ashland New Play Festival, a Semi-Finalist for the Bay Area Playwrights Festival (2017), a Semi-Finalist for the Premier Stages 2017 Play Festival, a Semi-Finalist for the Id Theaters 2017 Playwriting Conference, a Finalist for the Hudson River Artists Playwriting Award (2017), 1 of 29 in final consideration for the PlayPenn New Play Development Conference (2017), a Semi-Finalist for 2016 Eugene O'Neill National Playwrights Conference, a Semi-Finalist for Stage Left Theatre's Playwriting Residency (Chicago, 2017). Sarah was honored to be commissioned by Center Stage (Baltimore) to participate in the "My America: She" project. 
